

## Towards a more effective remedial teaching based on efficient European practices

## **Brief description**

A consortium consisting of five ordinary secondary schools and the General Department of Wallonia-Brussels Education (W-B E) carried on an Erasmus + project from September 2015 to May 2017. The aim, focussed on remedial teaching was twofold: to develop a compendium of good practices and to create a training module for head teachers and teaching staff.

## Observation place(s)

The W-B E consortium for remediation, composed of teachers and principals, was given the opportunity, with the support of the European Commission, to observe teaching practices during the first quarter of 2016 in three European countries: England, Italy and the Netherlands, chosen for their good progress on international tests over the last years. The five schools of this consortium also shared some of their own best pratices which existed before the Erasmus + project.

## Objectives

Clearly, it is a matter of sharing and disseminating teaching practices related to remedial teaching that have attracted participants in the Erasmus + project. Each sheet of the compendium describes a practice in a few words. It is sometimes an innovative or surprising process, sometimes it's a way of doing that exists in our schools but is more common in other places, hence the idea of retaining it to spread it.
